Dr. Clara Yang : *Recital*

Praised by Peninsula Reviews for her "superb technique and extraordinary musical understanding," Clara Yang, Assistant Professor at UNC Chapel Hill has performed in venues such as the Weill Hall at Carnegie Hall, Remonstrantse Kerk in the Netherlands, the Seymour Centre in Sydney, the Irvine Barclay Theater, the Kodak Hall at the Eastman Theater, and the Sunset Center in Carmel, among many others. Her live performance was heard on ABC Classic FM in Australia and New Zealand. She was featured in Wayne Picciano's "Grand Piano Show", performing Chopin's third sonata. Her 2011-2012 season includes a concerto performance of the Beethoven Choral Fantasy with Vladimir Ashkenazy conducting the European Union Youth Orchestra and a solo recital tour in several major conservatories in China. Her past concerto highlights include performances with the Pacific Symphony Orchestra under Carl St. Clair, the Eastman Philharmonia under Jeff Tyzik, the California Youth Symphony, the St. Andrew Chamber Orchestra, and the Saratoga Symphony Orchestra. She has performed in renowned music festivals such as the Music Academy of the West, the Sarasota Music Festival, the International Holland Music Sessions, and the Aspen Music Festival. Her recording on the Ullanta Artists label is featured on Lowell Liebermann's official website. An avid chamber musician, Clara has collaborated with members of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the San Diego Symphony, and the Hong Kong Philharmonic.



Dr. Yang joined the faculty of University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in January, 2011. A student of three legendary teachers Nelita True, Claude Frank, and John Perry, she received degrees from the Eastman School of Music (double-degree: DMA Piano Performance and MA Music Theory Pedagogy), Yale School of Music (MM, Artist Diploma), and University of Southern California (BM, magna cum laude). At Yale, she also studied chamber music with David Shifrin, Peter Frankl and the late Jesse Levine.

Dr. Yang has been successful in numerous competitions: she was awarded the first prize in the 2010 Eastman Rachmaninoff Concerto Competition, the American Protege International Competition, the San Jose Beethoven Competition, the San Francisco Chopin Competition, among many others. She was a finalist in the Stravinsky International Piano Competition, and she was also one of the three Americans chosen from worldwide live auditions to compete in the prestigious Sydney International Piano Competition in 2004.

Dr. Yang has worked with numerous world-renowned performers and pedagogues, such as Boris Berman, Malcolm Bilson, Peter Frankl, Karl Heinz Kammerling, Robert Levin, Jerome Lowenthal, Lee Kum-Sing, Paul Badura-Skoda, Herbert Stession, and Daniel Pollack. She has performed in chamber music master classes of Menahem Pressler, the Emerson String Quartet, the Ysaye String Quartet, Raphael Trio and the Eroica Trio. Her former principal teachers include Prof. Hans Boepple from Santa Clara University, Profs. Guang-Ren Zhou and Hui-Li Li from Beijing Central Conservatory of Music.

As a sought-after teacher, Dr. Yang has frequently given masterclasses and recitals in the United States and abroad. She has been selected for inclusion in Who's Who Among Fine Arts Higher Education. Her students have been state and national prizewinners. Aside from music, Dr. Yang has received awards from the Society of Women Engineers and the League of American Pen Women.
